















Protect children from respiratory illnesses this winter

Respiratory illnesses tend to increase as we spend more time indoors. Common colds, the flu and COVID-19 spread through tiny droplets as people who are sick breath, talk, cough or sneeze. When other people touch these droplets and then their eyes, mouth, or nose before washing their hands they may become sick.

There are a handful of steps both children and adults can take to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based sanitizer if soap and water is not available.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth, and nose.
- · Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- If you have symptoms, stay home, and stay away from people at higher risk of serious illness.

Flu and COVID-19 vaccinations

The best way to protect others and reduce the risk of getting sick with the flu and COVID-19 is to get immunized. The flu and COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and available for free to anyone aged six months and older.

It is much safer to get the vaccines than to get the illnesses. Register your children with the Get Vaccinated system so that you can be invited to book their vaccinations when they are due.

2024-2025 Registration

It's time to register new students for the 2024-2025 school year! Please read the following information carefully.

NOTE: You only need to register your child if they are not already attending school in the district. You can safely ignore this message if your child is a student in a district school or if they are transitioning between elementary, middle, or high school.

New registrations for the 2024-2025 school year will open on **November 6, 2024** and close on **January 26, 2024**. As long as you register before **January 26, 2024**, the day you register will not affect your chances of getting into your catchment school.

- 1. Although we do our best to place new students at their preferred schools, it is regrettably not always possible. Our district has significant capacity challenges because of limited space in schools and a growing student population.
- 2. If the number of requests for a catchment exceeds the number of available spots, the district reserves the right to use a lottery system to determine placements.
- 3. The district will confirm all enrollment requests by the end of March 2024.

How to Register a New Student as a Parent or Legal Guardian

- 1. Book a 10-minute appointment with our Registration Team.
- 2. If you need a translator for your registration appointment, please let us know in advance and we will do our best to accommodate your request.
- 3. BOOK YOUR APPOINTMENT ONLINE

NOTE: We do not accept bookings before November 6. Please ensure you choose appointments on days and times from November 6,2023 until January 26, 2024.

What to do on the Day of Your Appointment

- 1. Visit our Registration Team at the Welcome Centre located in New Westminster Secondary School (enter through the south side of the building at **820 6th Street, New Westminster**).
- 2. Bring a completed <u>registration form</u> and copies of the documents outlined in the <u>Document Guide for Parents</u> and <u>Caregivers</u>. **OR** Bring original versions of the documents outlined in the <u>Document Guide for Parents and Caregivers</u> and our team will help you print, photocopy and complete the required paperwork.
- 3. If you do not have the suggested documents outlined in the Document Guide, our team will be happy to speak with you confidentially to find a solution.

KEY DATES FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR

We are always excited to welcome new families to the District. Here are the things you need to know to ensure your student is enrolled with the best placement to support their needs.

Key dates for regular registration:

| | In-catchment applications | Transfer requests & Out-of-district applications |

| Regular registration closes | January 26, 2024 | February 23, 2024 |
| Placement offers | March 29, 2024 | June 14, 2024 |

Please note: our District is facing significant capacity challenges, due to growing enrollment. Decisions about the 2024–25 school year are based on enrollment demands identified within the regular registration window. Enrolment applications received outside of this window will be placed within the district but may not be possible at the catchment or preferred school requested, as some schools may be deemed as being at full capacity at certain grades, or in some limited cases, for the full school. All placements follow the rules outlined in <u>Administrative Procedure</u> 300.

How to enrol:

Our Central Registration team works out of the Welcome Centre (south side of New Westminster Secondary School, via the external entrance). Programs of Choice:

Applications for our Programs of Choice are accepted from Monday January 8th to Friday February 2nd, via links that will be posted on the District website. Parent information sessions are hosted online in early January. **Students applying for a Program of Choice must first be enrolled at their regular catchment school, following the above process.**
